DAVAO TODAY JOURNALISM 101 TRAINING

Background

Journalism is the faithful reproduction of real stories, reporting of events and analysis of issues and trends. Its function is mainly to inform and reach a broad audience which will enable them to discern and act. The importance of journalism comes from the people's right to share and express what is happening in their daily lives. People today depend greatly on the media in keeping them informed. Journalism is the 'voice of the voiceless' and it plays the role of 'watch-dog' in our society. It links government officials and the people. It handles all public issues. The media, therefore, is the people's open forum. The media creates an environment where people get information and be prepared to take part in the exercise of democracy. People's participation is the foundation of democracy.

The recognition of the crucial role of the media pushed for the birth of student publication. In the Philippines, the Campus Journalism Act of 1991 acknowledges the need to uphold and protect the freedom of the press even at the campus level and promote the development and growth of campus journalism.

Long before the law is enacted, campus journalism in the Philippines started when the University of Santo Tomas published El Liliputiense in 1890. However, historians claim that the history of campus journalism in the country started when the University of the Philippines published The College Folio, now The Philippine Collegian, in 1910. They also added that The Torch of the Philippine Normal University, The Guidon of the Ateneo de Manila University, and The Varsitarian of the University of Santo Tomas were also published two years later.

With the rise of student publications, it has served as a venue in the exercise of campus press freedom. Through the student paper, both the campus journalists and the target audience appreciate the role of the press in shaping public opinion and the importance of maintaining the highest standards of practice of the journalism profession.

The explosion of social media has made it possible for citizens and ordinary folks to become "citizen journalists." One need not have journalism degree or properly trained on news writing and events reporting to be able to publish articles, photos and videos of actual events. Technology has certainly democratized the source of news and the public do not anymore rely on established media entities for its information and news. On the other hand, the democratization of news sources through social media networking sites has also produced the phenomenon of "fake news."

Indeed, the basic tenets of responsible journalism remain an adamant and pressing issue of the current times. At the core of every self-respecting journalist—whether a social media blogger or a working media practitioner—is as basic as this: One must adhere to and observe accurate and fair reporting at all times. One must double check facts, figures, names, dates, spellings and pronunciation. One must ensure that there are enough contexts in the story to ensure balance and fairness, including disclosure of important information.

Journalists are trained early on to get the news as accurate or as faithful to reality as possible. He or she must protect the sources especially those with privileged information. Plagiarism and taking bribes are anathema to journalists.

Journalism 101

In pursuit of the ideals of responsible journalism, and holding dear to its mission of providing fair, indepth, relevant information to readers in Davao City and worldwide, Davao Today embarks on developing homegrown journalists from student publications and interested parties by giving free multimedia journalism seminar.

The level of importance in upgrading journalism skills will enable student publications see the broader vision of the media world they work in. These skills will help in creating dynamic, engaged and audience-driven publications.

The program design for student publications is a combination of theory and practice in the form of seminar workshops and joint coverage on particular issues.

Main objectives of this program:

- 1. Engage student publications to develop increased partnership activities with Davao Today to foster more contributions to the output of each media organization
- 2. Organize localized publication skills training workshop
- 3. Raise awareness among student publication with the latest situation of Philippine media
