**PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS PARTICIPATION IN ENSURING ACCESS
TO SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS**
(Re: Regional Memorandum No. 177, s. 2015, DepED Order No. 41, s. 2015 and
DepED Order No. 48, s. 2015)

To: SCHOOL PRINCIPALS/ADMINISTRATORS
Public and Private Junior High Schools

1. Attached herewith is the Regional Memorandum No. 239, s. 2015, entitled “Public and Private Schools Participation in Ensuring Access to Senior High School Programs,” in which the Regional Office reiterates the full cooperation of both public and private schools in ensuring Grade 10 students are better guided in making decisions on their preference and hopefully bringing in out-of-school youth and other school leavers to Senior High School (SHS) Program.
2. To maximize participation of public and private schools of ensuring access to SHS programs, the following terms of reference shall be faithfully observed by all concerned class advisers, school heads and officials from Schools Division Offices (SDOs), to wit:
 - a. Provide ample opportunities for both public and private schools to provide career guidance activities/programs to Grade 10 students so that the latter will have the necessary knowledge, skills and values to make career decisions of their own for successful transition from school to further education or work and hence to plan and manage their career pathways and learning throughout their lives.
 - b. Teachers and school heads should respect and not in any manner influence the decision of the students as reflected in their preference slip.
 - c. School heads shall facilitate the submission of the results of the Early Registration (**Refer to Annex A**) and submit to the SDOs for prompt collation on or before December 21, 2015, attention: Division SHS Coordinator, and onward submission to the Regional Office on December 27, 2015.
3. Any violation of these guidelines of the **Career Guidance Program and Early Registration** shall be dealt administratively, including in any case of control, manipulation and influence done by officials which shall be detrimental to students’ choice and preferences.
4. Prompt and immediate compliance with and dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is earnestly desired.

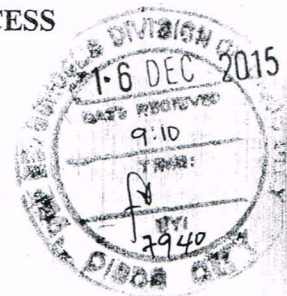


**PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS PARTICIPATION IN ENSURING ACCESS
TO SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS**

TO : Schools Division Superintendents

1. In reference to the DepED Order No. 41, s. 2015 entitled "Senior High School Career Guidance and Early Registration" and its amendment through DepED Order No. 48, s. 2015, this Office reiterates the full cooperation of both public and private schools in ensuring Grade 10 students are better guided in making decisions on their preference and hopefully bringing in out-of-school youth and other school leavers to Senior High School (SHS) Programs.
2. To maximize participation of public and private schools of ensuring access to SHS programs, the following terms of reference shall be faithfully observed by all concerned class advisers, school heads and officials from Schools Division Offices (SDOs), to wit :
 - a. Provide ample opportunities for both public and private schools to provide career guidance activities/programs to Grade 10 students so that the latter will have the necessary knowledge, skills and values to make career decisions of their own for successful transition from school to further education or work and hence to plan and manage their career pathways and learning throughout their lives.
 - b. Teachers and school heads should respect and not in any manner influence the decision of the students as reflected in their preference slip.
 - c. School heads shall facilitate the submission of the results of the Early Registration (Refer to Annex A) and submit to the SDOs for prompt collation and onward submission to DepED Regional Office on or before December 27, 2015, attention: OIC- Chief, Curriculum and Learning Management Division, DepED RO XI, F. Torres Street, Davao City.
 - d. SDOs shall monitor compliance of schools with the Early Registration and gather data on the results of the said activity.
3. Any violation of these guidelines of the **Career Guidance Program and Early Registration** shall be dealt administratively, including in any case of control manipulation and influence done by officials which shall be detrimental to students' choice and preferences.
4. Prompt and immediate compliance with and dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is earnestly desired.
