CONDUCT OF DIVISION EVALUATION FOR BRIGADA ESKWELA 2021 BEST IMPLEMENTING SCHOOLS SEARCH IN PREPARATION FOR THE REGIONAL SEARCH

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chiefs, CID and SGOD Public Schools District Supervisors Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads

- 1. Unnumbered Regional Memorandum dated December 23, 2021 of DepEd Regional Office XI informs the field of the conduct of the Regional Search for Brigada Eskwela 2021 Best Implementing Schools.
- 2. The memorandum sets the criteria for the Regional Search and the deadline for the submission of Division Entries on January 23, 2022. The tentative date for the evaluation at the regional level is set on January 24 to February 11, 2022. The regional evaluation may be conducted via online/offline/onsite mode or a combination of the three depending on the health and safety protocols in effect during the evaluation.
- 3. In preparation for the regional evaluation, a division evaluation of schools which are finalists to Division Level Search shall be conducted on January 11-14, and 18, 2022 (see annex A for list of finalists; annex B for schedule of onsite visits).
- 4. The division evaluation shall be conducted by a committee composed of personnel listed below. They shall conduct onsite evaluation and shall provide technical assistance to the division entries to the regional level search. The official scoresheet during the evaluation is provided in the annexes (annex C).
