The power of education has no boundary. It is not enough that we only learn to read, write and count. Through education, we gain knowledge and skills to enhance our lives and environment. At the same time, we cannot overlook the role of education to inculcate non-cognitive learning such as values, ethics, social responsibility, civic engagement and citizenship. Education can transform the way we think and act to build more just, peaceful, tolerant and inclusive societies.

The emergence of the COVID 19 pandemic brought a challenging time in the education sector. This massive disruption brought by public health emergency is unprecedented as it requires us to work together to safeguard the continuity of learning and preserve the overall well-being of our learners, teachers and all DepEd personnel.

Against the backdrop of an increasingly globalized and interconnected world, and amidst calls for education to promote peace, well-being, prosperity and sustainability, there is growing interest in Global Citizenship Education (GCED), especially after the launch of the Global Education First Initiative (GEFI) in 2012 (United Nations, n.d).
