Gender-based sexual harassment can be experienced anywhere, be it in public spaces, offices, or educational institutions. Likewise, the Republic Act No. 11313 "An Act Defining Gender-Based Sexual Harassment in Streets, Public Spaces, Online, Workplaces, Educational or Training Institutions, Providing Protective measures and Prescribing Penalties Therefor," otherwise known as the "Safe Spaces Act" is a more comprehensive act that creates a more comprehensive coverage of gender-based sexual harassment in any space, including the online space.

As set out in the DepEd Order No. 32, series of 2017 or the Gender-Responsive Basic Education Policy in line with its Gender and Development (GAD) mandate as stipulated in the 1987 Philippine Constitution, Republic Act (RA) No. 9710 or the Magna Carta of Women (MCW), RA 10533 or the Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013, and the Philippines' International Human Rights Commitments to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), among others, the Department of Education commits integrating the principles of gender equality, gender equity, gender sensitivity, non-discrimination, and human rights, in the provision and governance of basic education.

Given this, the Bureau of Human Resource and Organizational Development through the Employee Welfare Division (BHROD-EWD) GAD Secretariat in coordination with the ESD Global Asia Pacific will be implementing a training course on, "Empowerment Self-Defense Training of Trainers". This is in recognition of the need to build competencies of the DepEd personnel to be equipped with the concepts, knowledge, and skills to gain insight into how the ESD methodology can be integrated into the classroom. The course shall commence from

23-27, August 2022 (inclusive of travel time) in Cebu. Exact location will be communicated to the confirmed participants once finalized.

Target/Participants

This course is designed to create a pool of trainers who will provide training and coaching assistance to their respective personnel and learners. Below are the guidelines for the nomination of the participant/s:

- Each Regional Office shall nominate only one (1) participant (either from the Regional Office, SDO, or School) using the ESD Participant's Information Profile Template (Annex A) or download it using this link: https://bit.ly/infosheetESD on or before August 15, 2022;
- The nominated participant/s shall wait for the confirmation email by the BHROD-EWD GAD Unit upon the completion of pre-work activities;
- 3. The nominated participant/s shall or at least have the following:
 - a. Already have some knowledge and insight into Gender-Based Violence (GBV)
 - Have the disposition to collaborate in decision-making and problem-solving situations
 - Have experience in public speaking, facilitating, and/or teaching and is comfortable in physical expression
 - d. Currently involved in community organizations on a local and regional level
 - e. Open to doing collaborative work, have tools to process and deal with trauma (theirs and others)
 - f. Believe in community and participatory-based practices
- Due to the physical demand of the training course, participant/s must be physically fit to perform the tasks and activities.

The trained participants are expected to re-echo the training content and will be the recipients of the series of training related to ESD – including the coaching and mentoring online.

Notations

- Funds have been downloaded to the Region VII to cover the board and lodging expenses of participants, Central Office (CO) and resource speakers/facilitators.
- 2. Travel expenses of participants shall be charged against their respective local funds.
- 3. All expenses of CO facilitators and staff shall be charged against CO Funds; and
- 4. All expenses are subject to existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

LEARNING PLAN

The following transversal skills will be taken into consideration throughout the training and teaching of activities:

- 1. Nuances between age groups
- 2. Gender sensitivity
- 3. Culturally appropriate
- 4. Trauma-informed practices

ESD Training outcomes:

- A 50% less likelihood of rape, victimization, or attack of any sort.
- Less likelihood of experiencing depression and alcohol abuse.
- 46% less likely to leave school without finishing.
- 52%have used skills to stop an assault on another person

TRAINING PROGRAM BENEFICIARIES/ PARTICIPANTS

This course is designed to create a pool of trainers who will provide training and coaching assistance to their respective personnel and learners.

This activity involves the following participants:

- (16) Regional Representatives
- (1) Regional Partner (SDO-Cebu)
- (8) DepEd Central Office Representatives and Support Staff
- (4) ESD Global (Resource Persons)

The trained participants are expected to re-echo the training content and will be the recipients of the series of training related to ESD – including the coaching and mentoring online.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES

ESD focuses first on the adage: the best conflict is one avoided, thus recognizing potential conflict and de-escalating are key tools. ESD's physical training techniques are based on effective, easy-to-learn, remember and apply techniques that are researched to be used in typical everyday situations. The holistic method of self-defense is predicated on using a method of layering or procedural memory, leading through success, framing challenging situations in the positive, and emphasizing the physical experience as opposed to overanalyzing a situation. We will also look at the common myths around physical self-defense eliminating traditional beliefs that disempower the individual and on the contrary, gives power to the assailant. ESD, while taught to individuals includes community building and advocacy as a pillar of its teaching.

The TOT course will have a 3-level approach to learning the ESD and IMPACT methodology. The key concepts are divided into 3 levels: Level A, B, and C, each comprising of three (3)-day, 8-hour training programs with a combination of ESD and IMPACT Personal Safety training which will be facilitated by the ESD Global Asia Pacific.

Key Concepts Taught in Level 1A:

- ESD Theoretical Knowledge
- A deeper understanding of the ESD methodology through our own experiences
- Awareness and situational assessment of a given moment
- The 5 Principles of ESD
- Boundary setting through games and exercises
- · Emphasize the principle 'Tell'.
- Introduce the basics and emphasize the principles
- 'Fight' with a mild undertone. Introduce IMPACT Methodology
