Participation on the Training Workshop on Campus Journalism

Cum Regional Schools Press Conference

In reference to Regional Memorandum CLMD-2024-050, this office informs the field on the conduct of the Training Workshop on Campus Journalism Cum 2024 Regional Schools Press Conference with the theme "Championing the MATATAG Agenda as a Change Driver through Campus Journalism", on March 11-13, 2024 for group events in Davao del Norte, and individual events on March 19-22, 2024 to be hosted by Davao de Oro Division and Municipality of Nabunturan at Nabunturan National Comprehensive High School in particular.

The conference aims to:

- a. demonstrate understanding of journalism through skillful execution in various platforms (i.e. print, broadcast, online);
- recognize the role of journalism in advocating social consciousness and environmental awareness;
- c. promote fair and ethical use of media as tenets of responsible journalism;
- d. foster camaraderie and enrich learning experiences through healthy and friendly competition, and
- e. provide learners the opportunities to use the skills learned in campus journalism for their future careers.

The events to be contested for 2024 RSPC are the following:



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- 1. Individual Contests such as News Writing, Editorial Writing, Column Writing, Feature Writing, Sci-Tech Writing, Sports Writing, Copy Reading and Headline Writing, Photojournalism and Editorial Cartooning in English and Filipino of both elementary and secondary levels
- 2. **Group Contests** in Radio Scriptwriting and Broadcasting and Collaborative Desktop Publishing in Filipino and English of both elementary and secondary levels, and Online Publishing and TV Scriptwriting/Broadcasting in Filipino and English for secondary level
- 3. Search for Outstanding School Paper Advisers and Campus Journalists
- 4. Contest on School Paper Category

A registration fee of **Eight Hundred Pesos** (Php. 800.00) shall be charged to each participant to be remitted to the Cashier of the Regional Office to defray expenses for certificates, medals, plaques, trophies, honoraria of judges for the individual, group/ school paper contest, accommodation, meals, and assistance to the host schools.

Moreover, the treasurer of DRASPA INC. will be collecting membership fee of One Hundred Pesos (P100) from school paper advisers and Ninety Pesos (P90.00) from campus journalists. Meals for the school paper advisers and campus journalists will be managed by each division.

School paper advisers in attendance of the said Press Conference are directed to prepare a catch-up plan for their classes and ensure proper arrangement of classes which will be monitored by the school heads.

Moreover, all participants are reminded of the following as articulated in the Regional Memorandum CLMD 2024-050: a.) Recognizing and respecting Intellectual Property Rights, the Office adheres to the rule concerning plagiarism. The Region



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reiterates its stand to disqualify school paper found to have copied and published text, graphics, and other materials without duly acknowledging their sources. The disqualification covers all sections of the school paper whether they are published in print or electronically.

- b.) SDO should strictly follow the "NO School Paper, NO Student Contestant" policy. The top 5 winners in all events per level and per medium shall be recognized and the points from individual and group contests shall be included in the computation of the over-all scores following the guidelines. However, only the 1* place winners in all events will represent the Region in the 2024 National Schools Press Conference.
- c.) Observance of the Department of Health's minimum public health standards which include but shall not be limited to wearing of facemasks, physical distancing and other related measures related to the spread of Covid-19 is still reiterated.
- d.) Billeting schools will be secured by the **Barangay Protection Office** which should have **Child Protection Desk**, and proper **Waste Management System** should be observed in all quarters. All participants are reminded to bring their own beddings. Cooking inside the billeting quarters is strictly prohibited.

Attached herewith is the list of the official delegation of Schools Division of Digos City to the 2024 Regional Schools Press Conference

Service credits shall be granted to all public-school teacher-participants for the services rendered during Saturdays, Sundays, holidays, or end of school year/summer (DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003) while Compensatory Overtime Credits (COC) shall be granted to other non-teaching personnel (CSC and DBM Joint Circular No.2, s 2004 for the services rendered during weekends and holidays.



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Travelling and other incidental expenses will be charged to School's Maintenance and other Operating Expenses, local/school/ Special Education Fund, School Campus Journalism Funds, and other available funds subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
