- 1. Attached is the Regional Memorandum ESSD-2025-157 dated June 10, 2025 and a letter from the Department of Health Davao Center for Health Development dated May 28, 2025, acknowledging the risks of Mpox in the Region and the need for the public to know the common signs and symptoms and its preventive measures.
- 2. Anent to this, to ensure the safety and well-being of everyone especially during the resumption of classes, it is encouraged to follow these minimum public health standards for Mpox in the offices/schools for effective control and prevention:
 - a. Practice good hand hygiene ensuring access to handwashing facilities with soap or sanitizers;
 - b. Sanitizing frequently touched surfaces;
 - c. Monitoring symptoms;
 - d. Avoiding close contact with sick persons;
 - e. Quarantining/isolating person with contagious disease; and
 - f. Seeking immediate consultation.
- 3. The regional office reiterates RM ESSD-2024-390, which mandates the implementation of Project SHIELD (Strategic Health Intervention to Emerging Health Threats through Information, Education, and Communication for Learners and Educators in the Davao Region) in schools and offices. This initiative serves as a proactive measure against notifiable diseases and health events. School heads and on-duty health personnel are required to conduct daily health status monitoring of learners and staff. They must maintain records and submit reports on suspected, probable, and confirmed cases of notifiable diseases to the Regional Office via the designated Google Sheets link: https://bit.ly/SchoolDseSurv2k25.

Furthermore, this Office reiterates RM ESSD-2024-390 or the implementation of **Project SHIELD** (Strategic Health Intervention to Emerging health threats thru IEC for Learners and educators in **D**avao Region) in schools and Offices as its proactive countermeasures to notifiable diseases and health events. School heads and health personnel on-duty shall conduct daily monitoring of health status of learners and personnel, and maintain a record on health status through **submission** of reports to the Regional Office on suspected, probable, and confirmed cases of notifiable diseases through Google Sheets via https://bit.ly/SchoolDseSurv2k25.


