We sincerely thank you for your hard work for the dreams and hopes of children in your region and we wish for the endless development of your school.

1. Introduction of the IWPG

The International Women's Peace Group (IWPG) is an international peace organization that is in special consultative status with the UN ECOSOC. There are over 118 branches throughout 130 countries with headquarters in Seoul, South Korea. IWPG aims to improve the rights and interests of women around the world, is working internationally with the heart of a mother for the empowerment of women, and is working to achieve the peace that transcends nationality, ethnicity, and religion.

2. Event Intention

Children and youth are the heroes of the future era and the seeds that will lead to world peace in the future. The 7th International Loving-Peace Art Competition is held to inspire hope for ending war and achieving world peace while illustrating a concrete vision of a peaceful world to be achieved in the future.
