Relative to DepEd Order No. 024, s. 2022, re: Adoption of the Basic Education Development Plan 2030 and Division Memorandum SGOD-2025-227, re: Attendance in the Conduct of "Reinforcing Division and School Based Capacity Building Initiatives on Planning Technologies", SDO Digos City through the School Governance and Operations Division will conduct a workshop titled, "From Vision to Action: Building School Capacities to Prepare Strategic Plans" on July 29-31, 2025 in a venue to be announced in a separate memorandum.

This activity is pursuant to Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001 (RA 9155) which states that schools shall have a single aim of providing the best possible basic education for all learners. Schools and learning centers are empowered to make decisions on what is best for the learners they serve. RA 9155 also entrusts to the school heads the authority, accountability, and responsibility to develop school education programs and sets of plans. Moreover, DepEd Order No. 024, s. 2022 stipulates that "All DepEd offices and units in all governance levels shall align their policies, plans and programs with the BEDP 2030."

This activity aims to ensure that the School Improvement Plans (CY 2026-2028) are aligned with the Basic Education Development Plan (BEDP), DepEd's 5-point agenda, and other DepEd's objectives and priorities. Specifically, this activity aims to:

- 1. discuss the 5-point agenda of DepEd
- upskill school heads' capacity in the preparation and appraisal of strategic plans
- 3. align the next cycle of the Enhanced School Improvement Plans (CY 2026-2028) with the 5-point agenda of DepEd.

The School Improvement Plan (SIP) is a roadmap that lays down specific interventions with the help of the community and other stakeholders. It aims to improve the four key results in basic education: access, equity, quality, resiliency and well-being including governance.

SIP development process shall still be guided by the provisions of DO 44, s. 2015. The adjustment will be on the alignment of the plan with the BEDP Results Framework and minor adjustment in the SIP Outline to make it compliant to the BEDP Results framework stipulated in DO 24, s. 2022.




