

OF SCHOOL LEADERS ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE

REVISED K TO 12 CURRICULUM

Date : August 18, 2025

- 1. The Enhanced Basic Education Program or K to 12 Basic Education Program is a response to local and global community needs and demands through its mission to strengthen the values of the Filipino people; develop a strong sense of nationalism; develop productive citizens who contribute to the building of a progressive, just, and humane society; ensure environmental sustainability; and cultivate global partnerships for development. The implementation of the K to 12 Basic Education Curriculum is considered one of the most significant educational reforms in the country, introducing several programs and projects that all aim to expand and improve the delivery of the Philippine basic education. Its primary goal is to equip Filipino learners with the necessary skills and competence to prepare them to take on the challenges of the 21st century. It also endeavors to make the basic education system in the Philippines on a par with international standards by ensuring that it is appropriate, responsive, and relevant to the learners and to national and global realities (DepEd, 2019).
- 2. Along this line, this Office will conduct training titled "Driving Excellence and Leading the Change: Training of School Leaders on the Implementation of the Revised K to 12 Curriculum" on September 16-20, 2025 at Greenleaf Hotel, San Miguel Street, General Santos City.


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
- 3. This training program is designed to capacitate school leaders—school heads and public schools district supervisors—in effectively managing the implementation of the Revised K to 12 Curriculum. Anchored on principles of instructional and contextual leadership, the program emphasizes systems thinking, curriculum alignment, learner-centered pedagogy, evidence-based decision-making, and strategic professional development planning. Participants will be guided through a series of structured, interactive sessions that cover critical elements of curriculum implementation, including learner development, curriculum progression, instructional coaching, assessment leadership, school context analysis, and programmatic professional development. The training also introduces tools and templates that support school-based planning, monitoring, and evaluation, ensuring that school leaders can drive meaningful and sustainable improvements in teaching and learning.
- 4. The meals, snacks, accommodation, and travel expenses of the participants shall be charged to HRD downloaded funds subject to the usual accounting rules and regulations.


