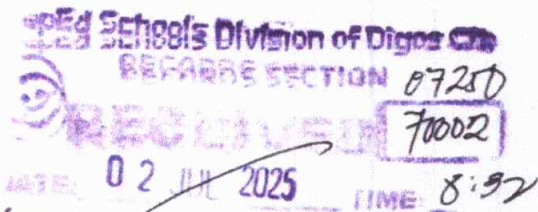

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**GUIDELINES OF THE 2025 INTERDIVISION RESEARCH COLLOQUIUM**

**Research Colloquium**

The Research Colloquium provides an academic platform where Basic Education Research Funded (BERF) studies are being presented, discussed and given feedback by the Top Management, program owners, teaching and non-teaching personnel and stakeholders. It shall also serve as a venue to commence the research journey of the BERF grantees.

**Mechanics**

1. The 3-day activity will be conducted through a blended modality, with days 1 and 2 via MS Teams and day 3 in person at Tagum City.
2. The participants will be BERF grantees who have successfully archived the study to the e-saliksik portal.
3. Days 1 and 2 are scheduled for virtual presentations and feedback, while day 3 serves as the in-person culminating program. Enclosed are the program flow and list of participants.
4. Grantees shall prepare a PowerPoint and a 2-page research bulletin highlighting key features (*enclosed*) and submit to <https://tinyurl.com/RXlcolloquium> on or before August 1, 2025.
5. Grantees are given 8 minutes to present the study wearing a DepEd uniform. For a study with multiple authors, only one grantee will present. However, all grantees may answer questions and receive the necessary complimentary certificates.
6. SDOs may opt to gather grantees at the Division Office if the internet connection at school or home is not stable, as long as no classes will be disrupted by adhering to Regional Memorandum 025, series 2023 re "Regional Policy Guidelines in the Substitution of Classes and Grant of Service Credits" is in place. Transportation, meals, and incidental expenses of grantees shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.
7. The Program Management Team (PMT) shall navigate the presentation materials.
8. During the feedback, the panel of reactors is given 7 minutes to comment or ask a query as guided by a criteria (*see enclosed*).
9. During the third day in-person commencement activity, all participants shall wear the DepEd Monday uniform (*current*), along with their IDs. SDOs may opt to provide transportation to the grantees to the venue.



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10. To promote the dissemination and utilization of research findings and facilitate networking, a designated gallery area will be provided. Each SDO shall showcase its research management accomplishments and best practices, and feature one literacy-related BERF study through a poster. The remaining grantees shall bring at least 30 pamphlets of the study for distribution.
