
PERSONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY BY BCYF

The Benita & Catalino Yap Foundation was originally established in 1993 as the Catalino D. Yap Foundation, in honor of the late sportsman, educator and civic leader. The elder Mr. Yap was one of the founding Governors of the Philippine Amateur Athletics

Federation, now known as the Philippine Olympic Committee. He was the head of the Central Luzon Athletics Federation, and was an Officer of the Basketball Association of the Philippines, and the Gymnastics Association of the Philippines.

Dr. Benita Yap was in Education for over 70 years. Author of over a dozen books, Dr. Yap was very much involved in socio-civic and parish groups. BCYF started by supporting groups, organizing Sports Events and providing Scholarships.

It organized The Dalubhasang Tanglaw Awards for Education. In time, the focus would shift to Social Development anchored on PSR.

10th CSR YOUTH AWARDS

The CSR Youth Awards was established to recognize CSR practitioners from the youth sector, be they from Business, Education, or other fields of endeavor.

The CSRYA has 3 parts:

- a) The identification of prospective awardees in one of 3 areas namely Citizenship, Sustainability, and Responsiveness.
- b) A follow through program anchored on advisory services from Deloitte Philippines, BCYF and from each network of partners and cooperating organizations.
- c) Assistance in reviewing the continuing viability for the long term of the specific awardees' area of activity and operation.







CSR YOUTH AWARDS

QUALIFICATIONS

- * Must not be over 39 years old at the time of the Awards Night the year of the Nomination
- * Must be a bona fide student in good standing of an institution or a working Professional with proof of employment, work, or business.
- * The Nominee must prove leadership for at least 2 years, for their nominated C, S or R project, activity, or business.
- * Initiatives must show a net positive impact to a group, community, or the country at large, that can be validated by proof, documentary evidence and referees. Initiatives must be replicable.
- * Must be willing to share expertise and experiences

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Completed Application I Nomination Form
- 2. Curriculum Vitae / Organization Profile
- 3. 2 x 2 Formal colored photos
- 4. Certificate of Enrollment (for students) Certificate of Employment (for employees)
- 5. Proof of business ownership or incorporation (for entrepreneurs)
- 6. Two Recommendation Letters
- 7. CSR Project Portfalio (photos and documents of valunteering experience in organizing projects with valuation or assessment report, including financial statements submitted to the BIR and/or SEC, etc.
- 8. Signed Privacy Notice and Consent Form
- 9. A minimum 5-minute video explaining why the Nominee should be the Awardee.

Note: All submissions must be notarized. Financial must be signed by a CPA and has a "clean opinion".

The Decision of the Board of Judges is Final.

Deadline of Submission of Nomination is September 12, 2025 - 5:00 PM

CSR YOUTH AWARDS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who can be nominated?

Individuals who are bona fide students of an institution or a working professionals who have initiatives that show a net positive impact to the community and have the willingness to share their expertise and experience.

Who may nominate?

Anyone can nominate. Self-nomination is also encouraged.

How many awardees will there be?

As many awardees who are qualified in the 2 Divisions - Students and Professionals.

What is the selection process?

- 1. Launchings will be held to call for nominations,
- Secretariat will review submitted nominations, and submit qualified nominees to the Screening Committee.
- 5. Screening Committee will evaluate nominations, conduct interviews, and decide on proposed Finalists
- 4. National Judging Panel decides on official Finalists and Awardee/s.

Can I send a substitute to the interview?

No. Failure to be interviewed on given schedule means your nomination will be considered for next year.

Can you be the leader and not the founder?

It depends. Your qualification depends on the extent of your involvement in the initiative on which you are nominated.

What do we receive for being nominated, finalists, and awardees?

Certificates, plaques, and trophles. You may be featured in appropriate media.

No cash prize per se, but you can submit a request for support with consultancy.

All those who qualify as official naminees will be given a formal online acknowledgement through a Nominees' Recognition night. Certificates of nomination will be sent within 1–4 weeks after the Recognition program.

All the Awardees will get their plaques/trophies within 1-4 weeks after the Awards Night.

The addresses stated in your nomination requirements will be the afficial address recognized by the BCYF Secretariat in delivering your certificates/plaques/trophies.



CSR YOUTH AWARDS

THE AWARD PROCESS

The following flowchart details the award process which all nominees in the CSR Youth Award, as well as other recognition programs of BCYF, must undergo,

- The CSRN Nomination nomination nomination
 - The CSRYA Subcommittee for Search and Nomination will accept and review submitted nominations. This committee receives nominations, or add its own nominees.
- From this, the CSRYA Permanent Committee will interview the nominees then decide who will be the Finalists, and recommend who will be the Awardee/s.
- The BCYF Board of Trustees will review the recommendation from the CSRYA Permanent Committee, and decide who shall be the Awardee/s.
