In reference to the attached unnumbered DepEd Memorandum dated October 22, 2025, re: "Declaration of Midyear Break as Wellness Break and Guidelines for Professional Development Activities," and Division Memorandum No. SGOD-2025-648, re: "2025 Digos City Division Research Congress," this Office informs all concerned teacher-personnel and students who are involved in the activity as research presenters, performers, TWG members, and others, that attendance in any of the scheduled activities on October 27-29, 2025, at the Division Conference Room and Crown Center, Digos City, is non-mandatory and purely voluntary.

This is in accordance with paragraph 5, line 2 of the attached DepEd Memorandum, which states: "If change of date is unfeasible, since the procured venues and meals can no longer be rescheduled, activities may still be conducted voluntarily." Hence, the 2025 Division Research Congress will proceed as planned due to the unavailability of another feasible schedule.

All other details stipulated in the DM No. 648, particularly the attendance of the selected non-teaching personnel, school heads, supervisors, and the members of the top management, shall remain the same and valid. Transportation and incidental expenses of all the attendees shall be charged against local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.

Moreover, in line with DepEd Memorandum DM-OUHROD-2025-2949, re: "Vacation Service Credits for Voluntary Participation in Professional Development Activities during the Midyear Break", this Office directs that teachers who voluntarily participate in pre-procured and preplanned professional development programs, as well as other DepEd activities during the Wellness Break shall be granted of 1.5 days' Vacation Service Credits (VSC) per eight hours (8) hours of rendered services, inclusive of the maximum limitation under DepEd Order 13, s. 2024.

Research Congress

The Research Congress provides an academic platform where Basic Education Research Funded (BERF) studies, non-BERF papers and Students' research are being presented, discussed and given feedback by the Top Management, program owners, teaching and non-teaching personnel and other stakeholders. It shall also serve as a venue to commence the research journey of the researchers.

A. Mechanics

- 1. The 2-day activity will be conducted through in person at Digos City Conference Room & PISA Room for the Day 1, and at the Hotel de Crisbelle, Crown Center for Day 2.
- 2. The participants will be the selected BERF and non-BERF grantees who have completed their studies for CY 2024 to 2025, and student-researchers from our public secondary schools.
- 3. Day 1 is scheduled only for the research presentations and feedback for the student-researchers, while Day 2 serves as the in-person commencement program, which will include selected presentations from both students and educators. Enclosed are the program flow and the list of participants.
- 4. Before the 2-day research congress, presenters shall prepare a PowerPoint, a 2-page research bulletin highlighting key features, a poster, and a pamphlet for the research findings awareness campaign (see enclosed).
- 5. Presentation materials shall be submitted to the secretariat on or before October 17, 2025.
- 6. Researchers are given 8 minutes to present the study wearing a Formal Attire (Black coat with light inner layer). For a study with multiple authors, only one researcher will present. However, all authors may answer questions and can receive the necessary complimentary certificates.
- 7. The Program Management Team (PMT) shall navigate the presentation materials.
- 8. During the feedback, the panel of reactors are given 7 minutes to comment or ask a query as guided by a criterion (see enclosed).
- 9.During the second day in- person commencement activity, all participants shall wear Formal Attire (Black coat with light inner layer).
- 10. To promote the dissemination and utilization of research findings and facilitate networking, a designated gallery area will be provided. The presenters shall bring at least 30 pamphlets of the study for distribution.

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

- In support of the Department's policy development process, research agenda, and policy and program development and implementation, the Department of Education (DepEd) continues to promote and strengthen the culture of research in basic education. DepEd hereby establishes the Research Management Guidelines (RMG) to provide guidance in managing research initiatives in the national, regional, schools division, and school levels. The enclosed policy also improves support mechanisms for research such as funding, partnerships, and capacity building.
- This policy which is built on the gains in evidence-based decision-making from various education reforms or initiatives shall strengthen the culture of research in the Department. In addition, it improves the fund-sourcing mechanisms, and reinforces the link of research to education processes through research dissemination, utilization, and advocacy.
- This issuance repeals DepEd Order (DO) No. 43, s. 2015 and DO 4, s. 2016 and other issuances, rules and regulations, and provisions which are inconsistent with this policy. These provisions shall be rescinded or modified accordingly.

Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this Order is directed.

This is to inform all concerned that the Midyear Break scheduled this year from October 27 to 30, 2025 shall be declared a Wellness Break for teachers, in light of DepEd Order No. 012, s. 2025.

This Midyear Break is a recognition of the need to support the overall well-being of our teaching personnel, which is a critical foundation of education quality, as stated in the Secretary's five-point reform agenda.

Schools and divisions must still conduct In-Service Training (INSET) and professional development programs on any other preferred dates within the remaining days of School Year 2025–2026 since these activities are intended to enhance teaching competencies and instructional effectiveness and to align the core programs and strategic initiatives of this Department.

The conduct of activities must not interfere with classes and may be integrated through school-based training and utilization of learning action cells. These activities may still be funded through existing Human Resource Training and Development (HRTD) funds that have been directly released to the Schools Division Offices (SDOs).



In view of the foregoing, for schools and divisions that have prepared and scheduled professional development programs for teachers during the Midyear Break period, procured venues and meals may be requested for a change of date based on prevailing procurement and auditing rules. If change of date is unfeasible, since the procured venues and meals can no longer be rescheduled, activities may still be conducted voluntarily. Teachers who participate voluntarily shall be exempt from subsequent activities on the same topic within the school year.

To ensure proper coordination and monitoring, school heads are required to submit their plans for professional development activities to their respective SDO through the School Governance and Operations Division (SGOD), while division plans for the conduct of INSET activities must be submitted to the Human Resource Development Division/National Educators Academy of the Philippines in the Region (HRDD/NEAP-R). The SGOD and HRDD/NEAP-R shall ensure activities are still conducted by the end of the school year.

This Memorandum modifies inconsistent provisions of DM-OULS-2025-095 in view of the declaration of the Wellness Break.
