



#### Mechanics:

# Accreditation and Equivalency (A&E) Elementary and Junior High School Levels A. Eligibility

Each Division shall send one (1) officially enrolled learner per level:

- Elementary Level (A&E)
- Junior High School Level (A&E) Learners must be registered in the Learner Information System (LIS) for School Year 2025–2026.

#### B. Objectives

The Written Spelling Bee Competition aims to:

- · Strengthen learners' vocabulary and spelling proficiency
- Build confidence in written communication
- · Enhance listening and concentration skills
- · Promote academic excellence among ALS learners

#### C. Skills Developed

· Communication, Confidence, Critical Thinking, and Information Literacy







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#### D. Competition Guidelines

- The competition will be conducted in written format. Participants will write the correct spelling of the given word on paper.
- Words will be selected based on the learners' level and aligned with ALS learning strands.
- · The examiner will pronounce the word, use it in a sentence, and repeat the word.
- · Participants may request the word to be repeated or used in a sentence once only.
- Learners must write the word clearly and correctly, following standard Filipino or English spelling conventions, depending on the round.
- · Coaching or prompting from the audience is strictly prohibited.
- The contest will have three (3) main rounds: Easy, Average, and Difficult.
- In case of a tie after the Difficult Round, a Clincher Round will be conducted.

#### E. Time Allocation

- · Participants must begin writing the word within 10 seconds after it is given.
- · The spelling must be completed within 30 seconds.

#### F. Correct answers will be given points according to the round's point value:

Easy - 1 point, Average - 2 points, Difficult - 3 points, Clincher - 4 points

- · After each round, scores will be tallied and announced.
- In case of a tie after the Difficult Round, contestants involved will proceed to the Clincher Round.
- In the clincher round, each correct answer earns 4 points until the tie is broken.
- The contestant with the highest total score at the end of the Difficult Round is declared the Champion.
- · If a tie exists, the Clincher Round will determine the final ranking.

#### Contest Event No. 3 - Word Factory

#### Mechanics:

#### A. Participants

Group 1: One (1) A&E Elementary Level learner per Division

Group 2: One (1) A&E JHS learner per Division

B. Time Allotment: 3 rounds × 3 minutes per round

C. 21st Century Skills: Critical Thinking, Communication, Vocabulary Development, Focus

D. Rules:

Only one (1) A&E Elementary Level learner per Division may participate.

 Participants must be officially enrolled in the Learner Information System (LIS) for School Year 2025–2026.

A Word Factory board will be used, containing a grid of randomized letters.

• Each round lasts for **3 minutes**. Participants must form and write down as many valid English words as possible using adjacent letters.

Words must be at least 3 letters long and must not repeat within the same round.

 Use of dictionaries, mobile phones, or reference materials during the contest is strictly prohibited.

Judges will validate words based on spelling, meaning, and appropriateness.

- SCORING: In the scoring phase, each player reads off his or her list of discovered words.
  If two or more players wrote the same word, it is removed from all players' lists. Any player
  may challenge the validity of a word, in which case a previously nominated dictionary is
  used to verify or refute it.
- For all words remaining after duplicates have been eliminated, points are awarded based
  on the length of the word. The winner is the player whose point total is highest, with any
  ties typically broken by count of long words. One cube is printed with "Qu." This is because
  Q is nearly always followed by U in English words (see exceptions), and if there were a Q







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in Boggle, it would be challenging to use if a U did not, by chance, appear next to it. For the purposes of scoring Qu counts as two letters: squid would score two points (for a five-letter word) despite being formed from a chain of only four cubes.

- TYPES OF WORDS ALLOWED: Any words (noun, verb, adjective, adverb, etc.), plural of, form of, or tense is acceptable as long as it can be found in a standard English dictionary (Scrabble dictionary is also applicable) Proper nouns (Smith, Ohio, France, etc.) are NOT allowed. Words within words are also permissible: spare, spa, par, are, spar, pare.
- The final score will be the total from all three rounds, based on the highest number of score.

Resources/Equipment

 Word Factory board (physical tiles), Paper and pencil for each participant, Timer or stopwatch, Score sheets for judges, and Dictionary (for validation use by judges only).

#### Contest Event No. 4 - Quiz Bee (Math & Science)

#### Mechanics:

A. Eligibility and Participants

- The contest is open to 2025-2026 ALS A&E Elementary and Junior High School learners.
- 2. Each Division must send two (2) participants, one (1) for Elementary and one (1) for Junior School Levels.

B. Contest Coverage and Rounds

- 3. Questions will cover both Science and Mathematics, focusing on real-life situations and aligned with the ALS competencies.
- 4. The contest will have three (3) main rounds: Easy, Average, and Difficult.
- 5. In case of a tie after the Difficult Round, a Clincher Round will be conducted.

C. Contest Rules

- 6. Each contestant will be provided with a bond paper and pen by the TWG.
- 7. The quiz master will read each question twice before giving the "Go" signal.
- 8. Contestants may start writing only after the "Go" signal. If a contestant writes before the "Go" signal, the answer is automatically disqualified for that item.
- 9. Answers must be written clearly and completely within the time limit given.
- Contestants are allowed to make erasures, provided it is done within the allotted time for that question.

D. Scoring System

- 11. Correct answers will be given points according to the round's point value:
  - Easy 1 point, Average 2 points, Difficult 3 points, and Clincher 4 points
- 12. After each round, scores will be tallied and announced.
- In case of a tie after the Difficult Round, contestants involved will proceed to the Clincher Round.
- 14. In the clincher round, each correct answer earns 4 points until the tie is broken.
- 15. The contestant with the highest total score at the end of the Difficult Round is declared the Champion.
- 16. If a tie exists, the Clincher Round will determine the final ranking.

#### Criteria per Round - Based on Bloom's Taxonomy

Easy Round (Knowledge Level)

- The focus for this round is Remembering, which involves recalling facts and basic concepts.
- · Questions must be in the form of Multiple Choice.

2. Average Round (Comprehension/Application Level)

- The focus for this round is Understanding and Applying, which involves interpreting knowledge and using it in simple contexts.
- · Questions should be made in a way that the learner gives the answer.

3. Difficult Round (Analysis/Synthesis/Evaluation Level)

- The focus for this round is Analyzing, Evaluating, and Creating, which involves higher-order reasoning and problem-solving.
- Questions should be made in a way that the learner answers and shows how the solution was obtained.

4. Clincher Round (Tie-breaker)

 The focus for this round is Applying and Analyzing, which involves accuracy and critical thinking under pressure.

#### Contest Event No. 5 - Scrabble

#### Mechanics:

- A. Participants: ALS Elementary/ALS JHS learner officially enrolled in the LIS S.Y. 2024-2025
  - Group 1: One (1) A&E Elementary Level learner per Division

Group 2: One (1) A&E JHS learner per Division

- B. Time Allotment: 3 rounds × 3 minutes per round
- C. 21st Century Skills: Critical Thinking, Communication, Vocabulary Development, Focus D. Rules:
- · Pairing should be draw lots (11 participants, 3 boards).
- · The winner in each board will proceed to championship round.


The objective is to attain the highest score possible using combinations of letters to form words noting that all the letters placed on the board have different values for computation. Below are the point values for each letter that is used in a Scrabble game.

0 point	Blank tile	4 points	F. H. V. W and Y
1 point	A. E. I. L. N. O, R. S, T and U	5 points	K
2 points	D and G	8 points	J and X
3 points	B. C. M and P	10 points	Q and Z

- When looking at the board, players will see that some squares offer multipliers. Should a
  tile be placed on these squares, the value of the tile will be multiplied by 2x or 3x. Some
  squares will also multiply the total value of the word and not just the single point value
  of one tile.
- Without looking at any of the tiles in the bag, players will take one tile each. The player
  that has the letter that is closest to "A" will begin the game. In case that a player got a











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- blank tile, he/she will be the first one to start. All the tiles will be placed back to the bag and will be used in the remainder of the game.
- Every player will start their turn by drawing seven tiles from the Scrabble bag A player can
  either place a word or pass but passing cannot gain scores. If any player passes two times
  in a row, the game will end and the one with the highest score will win.
- After the turn is over, players will have to wait until their next turn to place a word on the board
- When the game begins, the first player will place their word on the star spin in the center
  of the board. All players following will build their words off of this word, extending the game
  to other squares on the board.
- The game continues in a clockwise direction around the Scrabble board.
- Once all tiles are gone from the bag and a single player has placed all of their tiles, the game will end and the player with the highest score wins.
- When the game ends, each player will count all points that are remaining on their tiles that have not been placed on the board. This amount will be deducted from the final score.
- · The Scrabble player with the highest score after all final scores are tallied wins.
- Note: For this game, only the words that are indicated in the provided dictionary should be used.

#### Contest Event No. 6 - Sabayang Pagbigkas

#### Mechanics:

- The contest is open to Elementary and Junior High School learners for the school year 2025-2026.
- 2. Each group shall be composed of five (5) participants only.
- 3. The piece to be performed will be provided by the organizers.
- Participants are required to read the piece during the performance; it should not be memorized.
- The presentation must last for a minimum of 4 minutes and a maximum of 5 minutes. Performances shorter or longer than the allotted time will incur point deductions.
- Sound effects and minimal costumes are allowed, provided these do not overshadow the reading.
- 7. The order of performance will be determined by drawing of lots.
- 8. Each group shall perform only once.
- 9. The decision of the board of judges shall be final and irrevocable.

#### Criteria for Judging:

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#### Contest Event No. 7 - Story Retelling

#### Mechanics:

A. Participant/s- One (1) learner-participant per Division for the ALS Accreditation and Equivalency (A&E) Junior High School Level only.

B. Time Allotment: 4 to 5 minutes per participant.

C. 21st Century Skills Developed: Creativity, Communication, Confidence, Critical Thinking

1. Only one (1) officially enrolled learner-participant from the A&E JHS Level per Division may join Each district shall field only one (1) participant.

2. Participants must be registered in the Learner Information System (LIS) for School

Year 2025–2026.

 The Technical Working Group will provide the official Filipino story to be retold by all contestants.

 Each participant will be given 30 minutes to read the story, prepare, and wait for his/her turn to retell.

5. Each contestant shall retell the story within 4 to 5 minutes.

6. Storytelling must be delivered in Filipino.

7. For every 30 seconds exceeded, 1 point will be deducted from the total score.

8. Use of simple props or costumes is allowed but should not distract from the storytelling Minimal props may be used to support the performance.

9. The use of musical background or sound effects is permitted to enhance storytelling.

#### C. Criteria for Judging
