Date : March 4, 2026

In reference to the 1st Indorsement Letter from the Office of the Regional Director, DepEd RO XI, this office informs the field of the upcoming **22nd Women with Disabilities Day** on **March 30, 2026**. All schools are enjoined to observe this event.

The following activities are suggested and may be adapted to suit to the school's context, especially that learners will not be physically present in school on this day:

- 1. Social Media Awareness Campaign:**
 Launch an online campaign to highlight the contributions and challenges of women with disabilities. Students and staff are encouraged to share stories, quotes, and infographics using the hashtag **#EmpowerWomenWithDisabilities**. Schools may begin posting 5 days prior to the event.
- 2. Inclusive Art Display (Online):**
 Invite learners to submit digital artwork reflecting empowerment, inclusion, and the achievements of women with disabilities. The best submissions will be featured in a virtual art display on the school's social media pages or website.

Additionally, at least 3 schools with the highest number of likes on their posts after 1 day of the event will be recognized and receive prizes from the Division Office.

Pursuant to Proclamation No. 744 (2004) entitled Declaring the Last Monday of March of Every Year as Women with Disabilities Day, the Department of Education (DepEd) in coordination with the National Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA), encourages all regions, divisions, and schools to celebrate the **22nd Women with Disabilities Day** on **March 30, 2026**. This year's theme, "*Luntus ng Makabagong Babaylan: Pantay, Inklusibo, at Lahat May Kakayahan.*" celebrates women with disabilities as visionary leaders whose inherent capabilities drive meaningful inclusion and community transformation.

To support this celebration, all schools are encouraged to conduct activities aligned with the theme, including the following but not limited to:

1. Display campaign materials within school premises and on official social media pages. To ensure branding consistency, schools should use the official NCDA designs, which are available at <https://www.ncda.gov.ph/2026-WWD/>.
2. Integrate the celebration into the flag ceremonies by encouraging learners and faculty to wear purple ribbons or flaglets. In the spirit of female leadership, the assembly should be led by female teachers and learners, including a female teacher with a disability who will lead a pledge of inclusion.
3. Facilitate short, engaging sessions such as teaching learners basic Filipino Sign Language (FSL) for the theme "*Pantay, Inklusibo, at Lahat May Kakayahan.*" or introducing the Braille system by showing learners how to write their names using its characters and symbols.
4. Host programs that showcase the talents, skills, and achievements of women with disabilities locally and internationally. Schools may also invite guest speakers to share inspiring stories of leadership and empowerment.

The Department emphasizes that this celebration is a collective endeavor. This calls upon general education learners, learners with disabilities, parents, and all stakeholders to participate actively.

In compliance with DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2005 (Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task), these activities must be integrated into relevant subjects to ensure the non-disruption of classes and maximize instructional time.
