The Mount Apo Natural Park (MANP), also recognized as the Mount Apo Geopark, accomplished its Year 1 milestones in 2025 and is now embarking on Year 2 (2026) in its aspiration to apply for designation as a prestigious UNESCO Global Geopark (UGGp). This endeavor reflects MANP's commitment to enhancing the preservation and promotion of its geological heritage while advancing the sustainable development within the protected area.

In alignment with this initiative, teacher training was conducted last September 12, 2025 with participants from Kapatagan National High School (Kapatagan, Digos City), Inawayan National High School – Tibolo Campus (Tibolo, Sta. Cruz), and Pedro A. Arches National High School (Managa, Bansalan). The training module was provided to guide participants through the structured sessions and ensure consistency in delivery across schools. The training emphasized the interconnected goals of environmental protection, sustainable use of geological heritage, and cultural preservation. This approach reflects the broader vision of establishing the Mt. Apo Geopark and securing UNESCO Global Geopark (UGGp) status, which represents a holistic strategy to protect, educate, and sustainably develop the region, anchoring conservation efforts in both policy and pedagogy.

Furthermore, the program will continue to roll out training modules, formally approved through Davao del Sur Sub-PAMB Resolution No. 24, series of 2025, engaging a vast number of head teachers/principals across schools. These modules will harmonize CEPA campaigns with approaches tailored for school children, ensuring that environmental education remains impactful and sustainable. In line with the direction of MANP-PAMO to its bid as a UNESCO Global Geopark, teachers will subsequently integrate these modules into their teaching frameworks, embedding environmental literacy into everyday classroom instruction and nurturing environmentally conscious learners.

In this regard, we respectfully request your available schedule wherein we may be accommodated or included in your upcoming meetings or activities, with significant attendance/participation of all Head Teachers/Principals of schools existing within Mount Apo Natural Park to participate in an orientation session to provide essential information on the MANP UNESCO Global Geopark bid.
