

PARTICIPATION IN THE NUCLEAR SCIENCE CAMP (CAPACITATING AND MENTORING PROGRAM) FOR JUNIOR AND SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS

To: Schools Division Superintendents

1. Pursuant to the invitation from the Department of Science and Technology-Science Education Institute (DOST-SEI), this Office announces the conduct of the Nuclear Science CAMP (Capacitating and Mentoring Program) which carries eight (8) Continuing Program Development (CPD) units on May 26-27, 2026 at Ritz Hotel, Bo. Obrero, Davao City.
2. The activity aims to introduce basic concepts on nuclear science, showcase its applications in health, industry, and agriculture, and revisit curriculum strategies to improve delivery of Nuclear Science concepts to learners through lectures, workshops, and experiments.
3. The allocation of participants in each division is enclosed and shall be entitled to service credits in accordance with DepEd Order No, 53, s. 2003 titled *Updated Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers*. However, non-teaching personnel including management Staff, shall be granted Compensatory Time-Off (CTO) in accordance with Civil Service Commission (CSC) and Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Joint Circular No.2, s. 2024 on Non-Monetary Remuneration for Overtime Service Rendered, with specific reference to Section 5.
4. Lunch and two (2) snacks, training materials and certificates shall be provided to the participants and shall be charged to DOST-SEI funds. Travel and incidental expenses of the participants shall be charged to local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) made and entered into this JAN 31 2023 day of _____ at QUEZON CITY, Philippines, by and between:

The **DEPARTMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY**, a duly constituted national government agency under Executive Order No. 128, with principal office address at DOST Compound, General Santos Ave., Bicutan, Taguig City, Metro Manila, herein represented by its Department Secretary, **RENATO U. SOLIDUM, JR.** (hereinafter referred to as "DOST")

-and-

The **DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION**, a duly constituted national government agency under Republic Act No. 9155, with principal office address DepEd Complex, Meralco Ave., Pasig City, Metro Manila, herein represented by its Department Secretary, **JUAN EDGARDO M. ANGARA** (hereinafter referred to as "DepEd")

(**DepEd** and **DOST** shall be collectively referred to herein as "Participants" and individually as a "Participant")

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the **DOST** is the central government agency mandated to provide primary direction, leadership, and coordination of all science and technology (S&T) activities in the country and to formulate S&T policies, programs, and projects in support of national development;

WHEREAS, the **DepEd** is mandated to ensure quality, accessible, relevant, and inclusive education, including strengthening the teaching and learning of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) in basic education;

WHEREAS, the **DOST** and **DepEd** collectively recognize the need to uplift the status and quality of STEM in the country's basic education;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises and stipulations hereinafter contained, the Participants have reached the following understanding:

I. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this MOU is to promote long-term collaboration between **DOST** and **DepEd** in strengthening STEM education in the Philippines towards national development through enhanced scientific literacy, innovation, and a skilled workforce. The specific objectives of the collaboration are as follows:

1. To strengthen STEM education in the Philippines, by addressing priority areas such as teacher education, curriculum development, student engagement, resource management, and data sharing, among others.
2. Promote innovation, creativity, and critical thinking capabilities among Filipino students in basic and secondary levels.
3. Enhance the professional capacity of educators in STEM-related fields.

II. AREAS OF COLLABORATION

The collaboration shall be but not limited to the following areas:

1. Learner Development, Scholarships, and Student Engagement
2. Teacher Education, Capacity-building, and Human Resource Concerns
3. Curriculum Review and Policy Development
4. Resource Management and School Networks
5. Data Sharing and Collaborative Research

Other areas of collaboration may be identified, as necessary, and as mutually considered upon by the Participants.

III. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF DOST

The **DOST**, through its various attached agencies, regional and provincial offices, as appropriate, shall undertake the following:

1. Provide technical expertise and access to **DOST** resources and facilities for STEM education initiatives.
2. Facilitate the deployment of scientists and researchers as resource persons or mentors in the collaborative programs.
3. Develop tools, platforms, and learning resources to complement STEM teaching and learning.
4. Monitor and evaluate the implementation of collaborative activities and provide regular feedback to **DepEd**.

IV. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF DepEd

The **DepEd** shall undertake the following:


1. Provide expertise and access to **DepEd** resources and facilities for STEM education initiatives.
2. Ensure the alignment of STEM education initiatives with **DepEd** policies, curriculum standards, and guidelines.
3. Identify schools and ensure the participation of their teachers and students in the collaborative programs.
4. Monitor and evaluate the implementation of collaborative activities and provide regular feedback to **DOST**.

V. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING

1. The Participants shall undertake joint program/s, project/s, and activity/ies in pursuit of the objectives of the MOU.
2. Coordinating mechanisms such as but not limited to joint committee composed of representatives from the Participants shall be established to oversee the planning, implementation, and evaluation of collaborative activities.
3. The Committee shall meet periodically to review progress, resolve issues, and identify opportunities for further collaboration.

VI. NON-TRANSFER OF FUNDS

Nothing in this MOU shall obligate the Participants to transfer any funds. Any joint program, project or activity that will be implemented to carry out the intent of this MOU with legally binding



obligations, and/or involve transfer or payment of funds, shall be set forth in a separate written agreement, which must be consistent with this MOU and independently authorized by the Participants respective authorized representatives, prior to its implementation.

VII. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Matters pertaining to intellectual properties (IPs), and intellectual property rights (IPRs) that may arise from any project, activity, or related initiatives pursuant to this MOU shall be determined and agreed upon by the Parties prior to the implementation of the said project, activity, or initiative.

VIII. CONFIDENTIALITY CLAUSE

Except as required by law or pursuant to prior written consent, each of the Parties agree to protect and not to disclose any confidential information obtained or accessed through the other Participant on account of the implementation of this MOU. Parties agree to take all reasonable steps to ensure its personnel and authorized agents comply with this confidentiality clause. This clause shall survive the termination of this MOU.

IX. DATA PRIVACY

Should the Parties, in the course of the activities pursuant to this MOU, generate personal data and other information, the same shall be governed by the provisions of the Republic Act No. 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012 and other relevant issuances of the National Privacy Commission.

X. NON-EXCLUSIVITY

It is expressly understood and agreed by the Participants that this is not an exclusive agreement. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed as creating any exclusive arrangement between the Participants from either acquiring similar, equal, or like services or from executing similar contracts with other entities.

XI. AMENDMENTS

No amendment or modification of any of the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be valid unless evidenced by a written agreement executed by the Participants' respective authorized representatives.

XII. SEPARABILITY

If any provision under this MOU or any document executed in connection herewith is declared invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions hereof, insofar as they are separable, as well as any agreements arising from the same, shall not be declared invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, or in any way be affected or impaired.

XIII. GOVERNING LAW AND SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

This MOU shall be governed by Philippine Laws. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever shall arise between the Participants in connection with the validity, interpretation, termination or alleged breach of any provisions of this MOU, the Participants shall make every effort to amicably resolve such dispute or difference by mutual consultation within sixty (60) days.



Should the dispute remain unresolved by the end of the aforementioned period, the dispute shall be settled in accordance with Sections 66, 67, 68, 69, 70 and 71, Chapter 14, Book IV, Title III of the Administrative Code of 1987 (Executive Order No. 292) and Uniform Rules on Dispute Resolution for Government Agencies and Instrumentalities, and Government-Owned or Controlled Corporations issued by the Department of Justice, in relation to Presidential Decree 242 (Prescribing the Procedure for the Administrative Settlement of Claims and Controversies Between or Among Government Offices, Agencies, and Instrumentalities, including Government-Owned or Controlled Corporations and for Other Purposes).

XIV. VENUE

In the event that the Participants are unable to resolve any dispute, claim, or controversy arising out of or relating to this MOU through amicable settlement or other alternative modes of dispute resolution, the Participants agree that such dispute shall be resolved exclusively in the courts located in Taguig City, Philippines.

XV. EFFECTIVITY & TERMINATION

This MOU shall take effect immediately upon execution and shall remain in full force and effect for a period of **four (4) years** unless terminated, revoked, amended and/or the project duration extended by the Participants.

The Participants may terminate this MOU, in whole or in part, at any time by mutual consent of the Participants, provided that such consent to rescind is in writing and is signed by each of the Participants. The right to terminate this MOU by a Participant may be made by serving a Notice of Termination at least thirty (30) days before the date of the intended termination.


The termination, amendment, and expiration of this MOU will not affect the terms of activities on going at the time of notification of termination, amendment, and expiration, unless otherwise agreed upon by the Parties.


